- No quarantine for <u>Vaccinated</u> EU, U.S. visitors starting Aug. 2
- UK PM says wants U.S. travelers to come "freely"

LONDON, July 28 (Reuters) - England will allow fully vaccinated visitors from the European Union and United States to arrive without guarantine.

Travelers will still have to take a COVID-19 test before departure and soon after arrival in England.

The U.S. remains shut to British visitors so for the transatlantic carriers like British Airways and Virgin Atlantic, planes will primarily be carrying U.S. citizens to England.

British Prime Minister Boris Johnson did say on LBC Radio earlier on Wednesday that he wants U.S. citizens to come to England "freely" and is discussing a travel corridor with the United States, which would mean the restart of two-way traffic with the U.S.
